Sound Alliance Actions

Reverend James and other Sound Alliance leaders will meet with King County Executive Dow Constantine on July 8 to discuss the “Best Starts for Kids” levy and how Sound Alliance and the executive’s office can work in partnership. This meeting is the result of a Sound Alliance assembly on May 18 during which more than 100 Sound Alliance members, including 30 from Saltwater Church, gathered in support of the levy and to ask a representative from the executive’s office for a meeting.

Since then we have been busy setting up meeting sites throughout the county to train folks from our institutions so they can go out and give brief presentations to all of our members and other community groups to rally support for this levy. Along with Sound Alliance staff we have helped to create the training packets and the outline of the 30 minute message to be given to community groups throughout the county. We are going to reach out to many in South King County, if we are going to win out against the inevitable 'no new taxes' campaign that will develop. A briefing of our congregation is being planned for some time in September on the actual content of the levy and how we can help win that vote.

The ongoing work on the homeless day shelter has taken a slight change of focus - - finding a temporary smaller shelter, while awaiting the implementation of the grand plan of placing the day shelter on a new campus comprising several health and social service providers.

Finally, Sound Alliance Leadership Institutes are being offered on July 7 and 14, 9 a.m. – 3 p.m. This training, which teaches the basics of community organizing, is free to any member of our congregation. More than 15 of our members have already attended these. Super Heroes Summer

This year we will be learning about some Unitarian Universalist super heroes. We call them heroes because they tried to live their lives so that their abilities and talents became “super powers,” and they used these powers to make the world a better place.

Our summer program is offered Sunday mornings at 10:30 am for children ages 3-11. Each Sunday the children will be visited by a Unitarian or Universalist from history and enjoy crafts and games related to their story. See details about this summer’s classes below.

- July 12 *Theodore Parker* will help us explore what a conscience is, and how listening to our conscience can help us work for social justice. We'll make conscience touchstones and bracelets to remind us about our seven Unitarian Universalist principles.
- July 19 *Lewis Latimer* was an inventor who figured out how to make a longer-lasting lightbulb—one that was affordable for more people. He worked to improve the world by inventing things to make people's lives better. Children will experiment with making their own inventions.
- July 26 *Sophia Fahs* believed in the power of imagination and the ability of children to understand complex religious concepts. We'll explore the idea of what is the “me” that makes each person unique. We'll also use our imaginations building toys from cardboard.
- August 2 *Sundae Sunday* All ages will meet together today for an intergenerational worship celebrating the power of imagination and the Unitarian inventor of the ice cream sundae, Chester Platt. There will be an ice cream social following the service.
- August 9 *Malvina Reynolds* was a singer-song writer whose music inspired people to help make the world a better place. We'll work together to create a work of art that will be donated to our church auction.
- August 16 *Olympia Brown* was the first female Universalist minister. We'll talk about the importance each person having a say in decisions which affect them, and how we make decisions in our church.
- August 23 *P.T. Barnum* will share tales of his circus, the importance of finding fun in our lives, and providing opportunities for fun and learning to all people. We'll practice circus tricks and talk about how we “advertise” ourselves.
- August 30 *Celebrating Ourselves as Super Heroes*
- We'll hear about Christopher Reeve, a real-life super hero and the actor who played Superman. We'll talk about what each of us can do to help make the world a better place, and celebrate our summer by making super-hero capes.

Our Lighthouse building is receiving some much needed repairs and improvements, including foundation repairs, new front doors, an updated entry area, and windows in the classroom doors. During the remodel, especially during the foundation repair which is scheduled to begin on Monday, July 8, parts of the building will be temporarily unavailable. Watch for signs and announcements to let you know if children may be meeting in a different space on a given day.



In addition to front doors with windows on the Lighthouse building, windows have been installed on all Lighthouse classroom doors, making our classroom environments safer and making it easier for parents to check on children without interrupting a class. These improvements were made possible by the Fund-a-Thon at last year's church auction.

Saltwater Church adopted a Five-Year Long Range Plan in December 2014.

One goal of that plan is to provide sustainable, welcoming, accessible, aesthetically pleasing facilities adequate for a 300-member congregation, including 100 children and youth, that will accommodate worship; community, arts, and social events; and space sharing.

Since our current facilities are inadequate the Board has established a “Stay or Go” Task Force to research the two major options for facilities. The goal of the Task Force is to research which option, “staying” or “going”, will give us the best opportunity to live out the mission and vision of Saltwater Church.

The members of the Task Force are: Lucia Faithfull, Mae Gagnon, Galen Guffy, Geoffrey Jackson, Mary Paynter, Sandra Petschek, Jean Ray, Ray Valpey, and Peg LovellFord and Carol Mohler as co-leads. The Task Force has begun meeting in June and we even have a theme song.

Ways to Make Pledge Payments for 2015-2016!

We now have an on-line payment option available for you to use in making pledge payments or other donations. This gives multiple ways you can make payments to fulfill your pledge, (1) Make arrangements with your bank for them to send a check to Saltwater Church, (2) Mail your check, marked "pledge," to the church or put it in the Sunday collection, (3) Make your payment through the PayPal option on the church website.

You ***do not*** have to have a PayPal account in order to use this option. If you ***do not*** have a PayPal account you will enter your VISA/MC/Discover card information and enter the amount of payment you want to make. This can be a one-time payment or recurring payments such as monthly. If you ***do*** have a PayPal account you will be able to have your payment put on your charge card or taken directly from your checking or savings depending on how you have set up your account. PayPal will then send us a notification and Sue Eaton, Church Administrator, will enter your payment into our bookkeeping system.

We will see how many people want to use the PayPal option and how well it works. The Finance Team will be evaluating the success of this option later in the year so please let them know if you have any problems - finance@saltwaterchurch.org.
